DISCUSSION OF LINE-ITEM VETO OF AMENDMENT NO. 6 TO BILL NO. 2-26

MOTION TO OVERRIDE VETO

The Vice Chair gave information on the veto to Amendment No. 6.

Ms. Rodvien spoke on the amendment.
